With this in mind, we are requiring a strong commitment on your part to enter this ministry with a determination in your heart to see it through to the end. Your signature to this commitment form is your agreement not to compromise your decision to change, and, therefore, agree to give no time or expression to ideas such as: "I'm too homesick," "This is too hard," "I'm not ready for this" or "I don't want God shoved down my throat." We understand that feelings of homesickness and missing your family is valid; however, you must determine that you will *not* allow these feelings to drive you from your commitment to what God has for you through **New Beginnings**.

• Every other weekend (but not limited) is work Saturday and each client will be assigned a specific detail.
• There are daily chores assigned to each resident that they are to be for. (Failure to do so will result in restriction)

CACII (Georgia Certified Addiction Counselor)

Relapse Prevention — Using secular teachings along with biblical principles to bring awareness to the clients. Each client will learn to apply accountability, identify triggers, and learn application of real life studies. Each client will learn the effects that the substances have had on their brain and why they are feeling the way they do in their body. By learning new coping skills they will be able to maintain a clean and sober living environment. Materials used from SAMHSA, The Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous, Power Over Addiction, One Step with Jesus, and The Bible.

<u>Pharmacology-</u> Learning the withdrawals, side effects and recovery time from your drug of choice

Power Over Addiction - Learning about the effects that all substances have had on your brain, and body.

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Making Peace With Your Past - Learning how to forgive yourself from your sins as Jesus paid the price so we will not have to walk in condemnation.

<u>Anger Management</u>— Dealing with Anger using the Bible to help us identify our areas that need submission to Jesus and learn how to walk in His love and not SIN in our anger.

<u>Co-Dependency</u> – This class addresses the person who has let another person's behavior affect him/her, and who is obsessed with controlling that person's behavior. The client learns to recognize this behavior and learns how to deal with it, whether the behavior is in them or their significant others.

Six Elementary Teachings of Christ- To guide people to learn how to build a biblically functioning community as being followers of Jesus Christ.

Parenting Classes - Family nurturing God's way. (Georgia Certified Instructor approved by DFCS)

Family Recovery Group—Family Recovery is a class taught EOW on Saturday while families are visiting the women. This time serves as an opportunity to accelerate the reconciliation process of the woman and their loved ones in a safe Christian environment. Relationships are vital to a woman's recovery, which makes healing and forgiveness imperative. As families participate in Family Recovery, they begin to recognize the underlying causes of addiction, so they can break the cycle for generations to come. New Beginnings Ministry provides a place to manifest healing and move forward in the rebuilding of family relationships.

Introduction/Orientation- Review of NB rules and guidelines.

<u>Sociogram</u>-Sociogram serves as an opportunity for the women to learn how to speak accountability to each other and also gives them a chance to have truth spoken into them from their sisters. The women come into the Sociogram once a week prepared to speak 3 positive things and 3 negative things they see in their sister. The women speak what they see in each other in front of the entire body and staff and do so with the intent to build each other up, in love. Once every woman has spoken their votes, staff then ministers to each woman individually.

Inner Healing- Inner Healing is intensely spiritual and includes lessons and exercises around Rejection, Grieving, Forgiveness, Judgements, and Vows. This class is also very challenging for our women while they develop a true, deeper relationship with the Holy Spirit and find one's true self.

<u>Bible Study</u> During Bible Study, the teacher will typically pick a topic from the Bible and share it with the class while asking questions and getting different opinions or thoughts on it. This serves as not only a chance to learn more about the Bible, but gives the women a chance to share their personal interpretations and meanings.

<u>Intake</u>- At time of entrance intake coordinator will go over initial orientation packet, rules, and daily schedule.

<u>Celebrate Recovery</u>- CR is a 12 step program that utilizes the 12 steps along with 12 biblical comparisons. This will enable each lady to admit that she is powerless over all of her addictions and life damaging behaviors. This is a journey unlike any other where you meet the Lord, yourself, and continue through healing.

HIV/ Blood Borne Pathogen EDU- 2 Hours of education will be taught to all clients once a month by Lisa Gillespie, RN.

ASAM Level 3.1 - Clinically Managed Low-Intensity Residential Services, this adolescent and adult level of care typically provides a 24 hour living support and structure with available trained personnel, and offers at least 5 hours of clinical service a week. Level 3 encompasses residential services that are described as co-occurring capable, co-occurring enhanced, and complexity capable services, which are staffed by designated addiction treatment, mental health, and general medical personnel who provide a range of services in a 24-hour living support setting.

New Beginnings Client Progression

Remember your recovery is your responsibility, not ours!

Level I

Month 1-4 Entrance till the end of the 4th month In order to advance to Level II. In the 1st 30 days you will focus on completion of orientation, life story, and 30 day goals. **CR Steps 1-4** must be **completed within the first 4 months** (must be in written form of what the step means to you, and how you are walking it out on a daily basis). You will need to have **6** family counseling's (with the same person) and 1 individual family counseling (with the person's that will be taking you on your 7 hr pass), and you **cannot have any official restrictions before advancing to next level.**

PRIVILEGES: After 1st 30 days you will be eligible to receive 4 hour visitation EOW, and 5 minute phone call on the Thursday before visitation. Can begin working on community service after the 1st 60 days. Client can begin looking for work after completion of L1.

Caseworker discretion will be applied concerning privileges

Level II

Month 5-8
Beginning of
5th month till
end of the 8th
month

In order to advance to Level III you must complete CR Steps 5-8 (must be in written form of what the step means to you, and how you are walking it out on a daily basis). An opportunity for job placement, and finishing up community service hours. You will have completed your entire treatment plan that you have personally set for the first 8 months. You will have to have 8 family counseling's (with the same persons), 2 individual family counseling's, and must have 5 successful 6 ¾ hour passes before advancing to Level III. Can't have any official restrictions before advancing to next level.

Privileges: 6 % hr pass on visitation Sat from 10:00 a.m-4:45 p.m, and 5 minute phone call EOW on Thursday prior to visitation Saturday.

Caseworker discretion will be applied concerning privileges

Level III

Months 9-11 Beginning of 10th month till the end of the 11th month In order to advance to Level IV: Steps 9-12 of CR must be completed (must be in written form of what the step means to you, and how you are walking it out on a daily basis). Continue to work on established goals. If you are going to be leaving at the 12 months, get paper work for your exit plan at 10th month and begin working on it. Exit plan will have to be approved be a staff member. The exit plan is part of the curriculum. No exit plan NO certificate of completion. Can't have any official restrictions before advancing to next level.

Privileges: Every other weekend pass on Visitation weekend. Can begin serving as an SLT at the beginnings of 10th month if she would desire to. Has the option to go to GED classes, and DUI school after 10 months.

Caseworker discretion will be applied concerning privileges

Level IV

Beginnings of the 12th month until completion of program In Order to Graduate: You must complete all 12 steps of CR and have them memorized. You have turned in exit plan completed and approved by staff. At least 1 additional 1-on-1 family counseling to review exit plan before date of completion in order to complete. Attend after- care every other Thursday. Can't have any official restrictions before advancing to next level. No exit plan NO certificate of completion. Privileges: Every weekend pass (if it doesn't interfere with job). At time of completion you can go home for a 1 week vacation to see if that is where you want to live., can have phone, car(if approved) along with having a valid License and proof of insurance. Monday, Friday, and Saturday evenings off from church.

Caseworker discretion will be applied concerning privileges

Level V

Transition after Graduating program Working on long- term goals, or exit plan. Maintain employment, and can attend college if desires to do so. Has to attend all Level V meetings. Can choose a house of worship off of the property if desires for Sun & Weds, plus Tuesday evening service on NBM property. Can have own transportation, or working towards obtaining a vehicle. Can have personal cell phone and live in graduate housing. All clients are subjected to random drug and nicotine screens

If you are on a mandate longer than our 12 month program then you will remain at Level III until you are 2 months from completing your mandate

- Alarm clock with no radio; CD player with no radio. (Mandatory item) if you do not bring this item you will be deducted \$5 from your weekly budget of 15.00 until you have enough to purchase one.
- Bring a drinking cup with lid and at least one roll toilet paper.
- Identification: Driver's license, birth certificate, Social Security card, marriage license if married.
- Health/Medical Information: If you do not have test results for Hep A, B, and C; HIV, TB, and STD's, you will need \$200 to have your physical which will include theses tests.
- You will also need a doctor's release in writing for any mental health and pain meds you are on.
- Proof of income if you receive a check: Medicare, SSI, disability, etc.

Medical Information
